Douglas County School System Goals

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or Distinguished Learner on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts and Math End of Grade Assessments will increase by six percentage points.



Bright Star Elementary School Goals

Based upon the data from 2021-2022, the following goals have been set for the students at Bright Star:

- The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessments will increase by six percentage points. To prepare students for 3rd-5th grade, First Grade teachers will focus on ensuring that these students are:
 - ◊ reading 53-92 words per minute fluently.
 - $\Diamond\,$ able to recall 440-600 sight words.
 - ♦ writing a topic focused paragraph with 3-5 sentences with correct grammar.
- ◆ The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) Math End of Grade Assessments will increase by six percentage points. To prepare students for 3rd-5th grade, First Grade teachers will focus on ensuring that these students are:
 - ◊ capable of demonstrating an understanding of number sense.
 - \diamond able to master 0-10 addition facts fluently.

In Our First Grade Classroom

The first grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading, writing, and math. We will work with students and families in the following ways:

- By providing parents with a choice board to increase number sense.
- By providing parents with a selection of math fluency activities.
- By providing parents with fluency activities (such as fluency passages) to read nightly.
- By sending home the sight word list and writing genres quarterly for parents to review and practice with their child.

At Home

Bright Star Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading, writing, and math. Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- To choose an activity from the provided choice board weekly.
- To allot 1 minute to practice math fluency activities from 0 to 10 nightly.
- To administer a fluency check for 1 minute.
- To practice reading sight words each week to monitor progress.
- To write a paragraph based on a specific genre.

Bright Star Elementary School Students

Bright Star Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in reading, writing, and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school by:

- Completing the activities from the choice board with parental assistance.
- Practicing my math facts from 0-10 for one minute each night.
- Practicing reading the activities sent by my teacher to increase my fluency for one minute.
- Reading and reviewing my sight words to a family member each night.
- Writing a paragraph each week based on a specific genre.
