## Communication about Student Learning

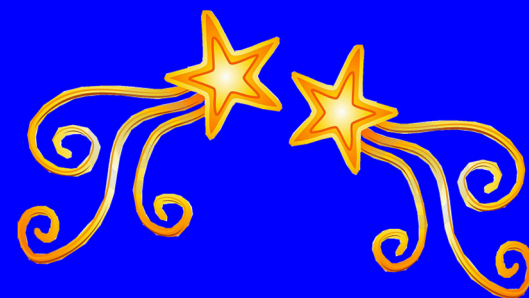
Bright Star Elementary School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you include the following:

## Our Goals for Student Achievement

### Douglas County School System Goals

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or Distinguished Learner on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts and Math End of Grade Assessments will increase by six percentage points.



### Bright Star Elementary School Goals

Based upon the data from 2021-2022, the following goals have been set for the students at Bright Star:

- ◆ The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the GMAS English Language Arts End of Grade Assessments will increase by six percentage points. To prepare students for 3rd-5th grade, Kindergarten teachers will focus on ensuring that these students are:
  - ◇ mastering the goal of reading 220 sight words by the end of the year.
  - ◇ able to write a complete sentence that corresponds to a student created drawing.
  - ◇ able to print legibly as required by GKIDS.
- ◆ The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the GMAS Math End of Grade Assessments will increase by six percentage points. To prepare students for 3rd-5th grade, Kindergarten teachers will focus on ensuring that these students are:
  - ◇ able to add and subtract fluently within 5.
  - ◇ counting fluently to 100.

### *Building Partnerships*

Parents are encouraged to volunteer and participate in his or her child's classroom. We do request that you schedule these visits with the teacher at least one day ahead by calling or making a written request to volunteer or observe in the classroom.

### *In Our Kindergarten Classroom*

The kindergarten teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading, writing, and math. We will work with students and families in the following ways:

- By providing fluency sheets with sums up to five to practice adding.
- By providing resources that teach counting from zero to a hundred.
- By providing sight words quarterly.
- By supplying parents with a monthly newsletter with the focuses on math vocabulary, writing tips, and sight words.

### *At Home*

Bright Star Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading, writing, and math. Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- To use the fluency sheets with sums up to five to practice adding.
- To practice counting with my child from zero to a hundred.
- To read the provided list and assist my child where needed.
- To read and review the suggestions on the monthly newsletter and use the strategies that are provided by the teacher.

### *Bright Star Elementary School Students*

Bright Star Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in reading, writing, and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school by:

- Practicing the fluency sheets with sums up to five to help with adding.
- Practicing counting from zero to a hundred.
- Review my sight words and reading the books on MyOn to help me use my sight words in context.
- Completing the activities on the newsletter provided by my teacher.
